APPLICATION DEADLINE FOR SEMESTER 1

The student must fill the incoming application form and attach all the required documents, including the LA signed by both the student and the home university : **until June 15th**

APPLICATION DEADLINE FOR SEMESTER 2

The student must fill the incoming application form and attach all the required documents, including the LA signed by both the student and the home university : **until November 30th**

ACCEPTANCE LETTER

An acceptance letter from the Université des Antilles will be sent to you within 6 weeks of the application form deadline.

TUITION FEES

Students taking part in the exchange programme must pay their tuition fees to their home university.

- **ERASMUS +** students are exempt from paying tuition fees and social security (the European Health Insurance Card is mandatory).
 - **Students from the BCI programme** are exempt from paying tuition fees but must present a certificate of health insurance coverage as per the reciprocity protocole between France and Quebec.
 - **Students from the University of the West Indies** or **falling under US bilateral agreements** are exempt from paying tuition fees.
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ECTS CREDITS

Credits are indicated in the course sheets which you can find in the pedagogic guides per field of study.

The number of ECTS credits to validate should be precised by your home university coordinator. All changes must be reported to him or her for approval.

ADMINISTRATIVE FORMALITIES

Course selection and registration, timetables as well as administrative registration takes place during Orientation week (based on the calendar which will be provided).

EXAMS

Exams take place following 2 formats:

- **Contrôles continus** (CC) during the semester, the dates are set by the professors

Or

- **Contrôles terminaux** (CT) at the end of the semester. They are set by the administration.

- **Make-up exams** : in case of failure to the semester exams. Consult the calendars of each faculty.

- Grading on 20.

GRADE TRANSCRIPTS

-Grade transcripts are established based on your course registration validated by the University des Antilles assigned professor.

We recommend you get in touch with your delegate teacher at your home university to validate your course selection. Any changes must first be sent to your delegate teacher at your home university. The number of credits to be validated must also be determined with the latter in order to facilitate your choice of classes.

-Grade transcripts are sent by email and postal mail to your home university at the end of the semester.

HOUSING INFORMATION

GUADELOUPE CAMPUS

We offer housing options through the **Lokaviz website** :

Important: Precise your date and time of arrival to the secretary of the welcoming department.

We also offer housing in individual rooms or shared accommodation from **private landlords**.

A directory is sent to you. You will have to contact them personally to make reservations.

MARTINIQUE CAMPUS

We offer individual rooms in the university residence or accommodation through private landlords.

- **Private landlords:**

A directory is sent to you. You will have to contact them personally to make reservations.

- **University residence:**

- No bed sheets or towels provided. Common kitchen. Price/month : 300€ + one month deposit (300€) + housing insurance.
- A cable for access to internet connection is needed.

FOR BOTH CAMPUSES

You can stay in a hotel for the first few days while looking for permanent accommodation.

HOUSING SUBSIDIES

Financial assistance is offered by the **CAF** (Caisse d'Allocations Familiales).

You will have to make a request once you are settled in.

Important :

- Birth certificate in french is mandatory.
- If you are hosted by private landlords, you will have to create a French bank account.
- This does **NOT** apply to American and Canadian students.

IMMIGRATION AND INSURANCE



VISA - IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS

UE Students : Identity card or passport.

Non-European students must arrive with a student visa. The visa request must consider the duration of the mobility (1 semester or 1 year).

SOCIAL SECURITY AND HEALTH INSURANCE

You must have *valid health insurance coverage*. It is **MANDATORY**.

- For European students:

European Health Insurance Card for the duration of your stay (request to be made directly to the organism in your home country)

- For Canadian students:

You must have, before your departure for France, a SE 401 Q 106 form "attestation d'affiliation à leur régime de sécurité sociale des participants aux échanges entre établissements d'enseignement supérieur" : the first part of the form must be filled out by your home university and the second by the Health Insurance organism in Quebec.

- For Caribbean students:

Register on: etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr

You can subscribe to complementary health insurance along with social security or get one before coming.

ARRIVAL

Once your accommodation is reserved, you must, once you arrive, take the taxi to your address in Guadeloupe or Martinique.

- Guadeloupe: About 40-50€ for the trip (destination Pointe-à- Pitre).
- Martinique: Fixed rates for major cities.
 - Fort-de-France: 25€ to 30€
 - Schœlcher: 35€ (by night 50€)
